STAFF/PROJECT UPDATES (continued)	Chairman Pinerola asked for a motion to clear undergrowth.		
ACTION	A motion to spend up to \$3000 to clear unwanted vegetation and undergrowth of the area between the Overlook and the river at Boatlanding Park was made by Meredith Johnson and seconded by Ed Martin. With 8 yeas, 0 nays and 1 abstaining from voting, the motion PASSED.		
PROJECT UPDATES (continued)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Kereiakas Park Greenways Connector Phase 3</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -to widen the sidewalk path along Cemetery Road as decided at a previous Board Meeting. -plans have been prepared and is being advertised through the City to get bids to widen the sidewalk path an additional 3' (making a total width of 8') between Cherokee and the existing Greenways path where there is adequate right-of-way. -unable to obtain right-of-way easements to widen the sidewalk path between the blocks of Cherokee Drive and Windfield Drive. -once bids have been received (bid opening date set for January 19, 2011), they will be presented to the Board for a decision and acceptance. -to be paid from remaining TCSP funds. <p>There was some discussion of whether it would be too expensive to complete this section of path due to the cost of moving several utilities. .</p> <p>Mr. Moore explains that the contract for Woodburn grant has been received for signatures from Frankfort. A resolution for Judge Buchanan to sign the contract will be on Fridays Fiscal Court Agenda. After the Judge signs the contract, it will then be sent back to Frankfort for more signatures. Once all signatures have been received, we should be able to move forward with the Woodburn/Richpond Connector. The total amount of the grant was \$990K.</p>		
NEW BUSINESS and/or DISCUSSION	<p>Tina Coates expresses concerns regarding safer bike lanes along Nashville Road. She suggests consulting with the City and/or State about the safety issues.</p> <p>Ms. Coates suggests that the Board to follow up on preserving the memory of the Quonset Hut site at the river where BGMU is now located. It was decided that Jim Bullington would follow up on the idea and he suggest getting Historical Preservation involved.</p> <p>Chairman Pinerola expresses his appreciation for several years of service to Tina Coates and invites her back to future Greenways Board Meetings.</p>
