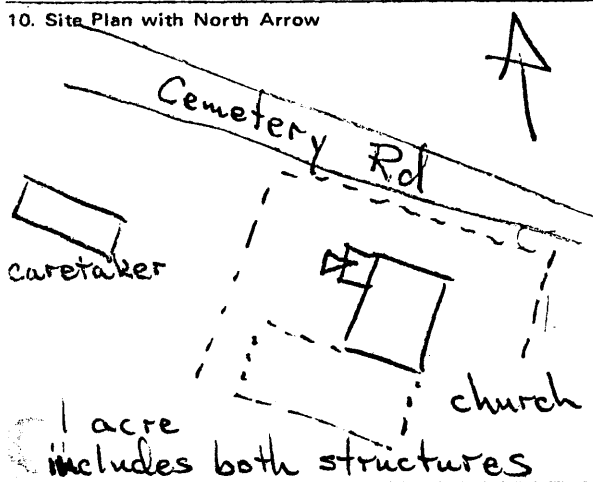

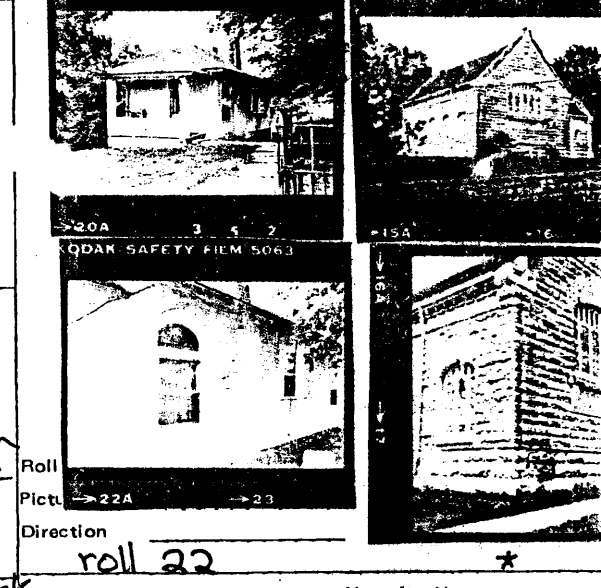

History \*\* Originally known as Drakes Creek Baptist Church - It was established in 1850 by the United Baptist - According to Church records, negro slaves were admitted as early as 1851 - The first church building was frame - In 1909 W H Burton church member, proposed that he build a new stone building with the only stipulation being that it be named in memory of his parents - charter members of the church - The building was completed in 1911 -  
 20. Significance Built entirely by hand using Warren Co. rock structure that exhibits qualities of outstanding architectural design and craftsmanship; surviving complementary structures and landscape elements. One of the oldest established churches in Warren County.

## Architecture;

80. This is one of the few instances in the region of a group of contemporary, apparently architect-designed buildings. The outstanding architectural design and workmanship of the stone church is supplemented and balanced by the sensitively detailed, shingled caretaker's cottage and by the fine iron and stone fence that surrounds the church on three sides. The church interior is essentially intact, and a later recent rear addition has left the rear wall of the original building exposed in its interior.
